Measuring Capacity

The students have been exploring capacity in the past week. We keep a collection of empty containers at school so that students can experiment with different sized vessels. To follow up on this activity, students are encouraged to look about at home to find different containers and how much they hold.

It is interesting for them to discover that some foods are measured in grams, such as yoghurt and custard, as they are not liquids.



Students have been comparing the capacity of different sized containers.

Measuring by pouring liquids from one container to another is an important activity. Students learn that short, larger containers can hold more than taller, thinner containers.
