# K-2 Beechworth Honey Excursion with Corowa South

Last Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June, Lowesdale and Corowa South K-2 travelled to Beechworth by bus. Mrs Strachan, Mrs Taylor, Mrs McDonald and Mrs Craft came with us. We split up into two groups to visit the Beechworth Honey and the Beechworth Bakery.

Our group went to the Beechworth Honey Experience first. We watched five movies about honey. Each was shown in a different room. We learnt about how bees make honey and how people collect and package honey.



The wax is scraped off the frames and the honey drips out.



The wax is made into candles.



The honey is heated gently. If the honey gets too hot it is no good. It is packaged into jars and bottles to sell.

The lady explained that it takes a long time for the bees to fill the cells in the hive. There are three types of bees; the Queen, drones and workers.



We found out that bees are **really important** for pollination of fruits and vegetables. Without bees we wouldn't have as much food!

The queen's only job is to lay eggs and a drone's job is to mate with the queen. The **worker** bees are responsible for everything else: gathering nectar, guarding the hive and honey, caring for the queen and larvae, keeping the hive clean, and producing honey.





We tried different kinds of honey. The honey has different flavours depending on the plants that the bee gathered the nectar from to make the honey. Creamed honey is whipped to add air.



The bee made by the Lowesdale Public School students and Mrs Fredericks in 2010 is still on display.
