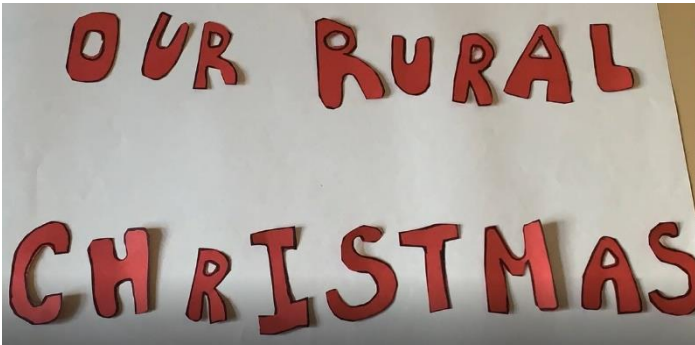

Ambulance Cover

Are you aware that ambulance cover is changing next year?

From next year ambulance cover for schools will only cover the state in which the school is located.

What does that mean for Lowesdale Public School students?

Lowesdale Public School students will not be covered by the school’s ambulance policy if they attend an excursion in Victoria (or any other state). If an ambulance is called and the student does not have private ambulance cover, parents will be required to pay the account which could potentially cost hundreds of dollars.

What should I do?

Lowesdale Public School families are encouraged to purchase private ambulance cover before 29 January 2020
