Virtual Canberra By Years 4,5, 6 & Mrs Wright

On Tuesday 10th November 2020 year 4, 5, 6 and Mrs Wright visited Canberra virtually for three days.

On day 1 we visited the Royal Australian Mint, Government House and The Observatory.

At the Mint we learnt about how coins are made. The holy dollar was made by William Henshaw who used a drop saw to press a hole in a Spanish coin, to make the first two Australian coins. The fifty cent coin was previously round. We had a tour of Government House where the Governor General lives. At The Observatory we learnt about how each year the moon moves 4 centimetres away from the earth every year.

On day 2 we visited Parliament house, CSIRO Virtual Ecology Lab and the National Gallery of Australia.

At Parliament House we learnt about two different rooms. The house of Representatives is a green room and the senate is a red room. At the CSIRO we learnt about conducting an investigation. We decided to investigate common birds around the school. At the National Gallery of Australia we learnt about Australian art and history.

On day 3 we visited the National Museum of Australia, National Portrait Gallery and Museum of Australian Democracy.

At the National Museum of Australia we learnt about objects that tell stories of our history. At the National Portrait Gallery we learnt about the Captain Cook 1782 portrait and Captain No Beard 2005 portrait by Daniel Boyd. We discussed why Daniel painted the portrait of Captain No Beard. At the Museum of Australian Democracy we learnt more about Parliament House.

Steph's favourite part of the virtual excursion was the Mint because we got to learn about how coins are made. Oliver Peterson enjoyed the whole excursion. Eric liked the Royal Australian Mint and the Observatory because he learnt about space. Harley enjoyed learning about the different portraits at the National Portrait Gallery and Oliver McLellan liked the Royal Australia Mint because he learnt about money.
