
the Finley Zone Carnival and our Year 5/6 students have attended a 3-day School Camp to Bendigo/Ballarat with Corowa South Public School.

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Stage 3 School Camp – Bendigo/Ballarat









Bendigo - Ballarat camp 5 - 6



On the 23.8.23 we left Corowa South on the bus to travel to Ballarat. The ride was about 4-5 hours long. First, we went to Rushworth for morning tea. We then stopped at Bendiao and went

morning tea. We then stopped at Bendigo and went to the Central Deborah Gold mine. We got to go down the mine and see all

sorts of things like drills, and gelignite. We learnt about how the early drills would make so much dust that it would make whoever used it too long fatally sick.

After the mines, we all got a piece of Albie's birthday cake. It was a sponge cake that had delicious cream and jam in the middle. Once all of us had finished their piece of cake we thanked Baz (our tour guide) and then we went to the gift shop where nearly everyone bought something.

Once we all got on the bus and Don (our bus driver) was ready we set off to the Miner's Retreat Motel where we stayed at. When we all got there, we got ready for dinner at the Robin Hotel. Once we made it there, we all sat down and got ready to eat. But since we ordered our meal before the camp, we didn't really know what we were going to have.

The next day we had breakfast at the motel, and we headed off to the Ballarat Prime Ministers walk at the Botanic Gardens. We saw all the Prime Ministers from Edmund Barton to Malcolm Turnbull. There were towering trees everywhere and it was freezing.

After we finished the walk, we travelled to Sovereign Hill where we first followed a person who was dressed like he was in the 1850's (everyone thought he looked like Abraham Lincoln). Then we played a little game. After that we had a quick look at the shops and then we went to the Red Hill mine tour where we went about 3 meters down under ground. Then we went to the gold pouring demonstration where a guy demonstrated how they made gold bars back in 1850 and before that. He told us that that gold bar has been melted and remade thousands of times. After lunch we went down to the creek and went gold panning. I believe that everyone got a bit of gold. Rider definitely found the



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most. And finally, we went to the confectionery shop where a guy showed us how they made lollies and have been making lollies since about 150 years ago (I think).

Next up was the light and sound show. There were three parts of the show. The 3d cinema, the outdoor projections and the most well - known part, Blood on the Southern Cross. In the first part we put on these 3D glasses and watched the process of how gold was first made along with earth. Whenever something would pop out of the screen everyone would try and grab it. Then we went onto a tram sort of thing and went to the second part which was projected onto the trees and lake. It was a dreamtime story about the making of gold. It was very interesting, and the projections were great.

The last part was probably the most interesting. We were seated in a cinema in front of a big screen. It talked about the settlement of the white people in Ballarat. But the most surprising part is when the screen began to split in 2 parts and fold to the side. It revealed a giant set that was decorated to be like Ballarat 150 years ago when gold was first discovered.

It told the story of the battle of the miners, who fought for their rights, the Eureka Stockade. The special effects were very cool like smoke and **A LOT** of fire. It also had a few projections of people doing things like protesting and lighting the Eureka Hotel on fire. It was cool watching all the tents light up.



The next day we went to breakfast and then we cleaned up and packed our bags to get ready to go back home. But before we went home, we went to the Eureka Museum to go see the real eureka stockade flag (but it has about a third of it missing). We were told about the story of Trooper King who supposedly after the battle was over climbed up the flagpole and ripped down the Eureka flag, and then shot it. He offered it to his commanding officer, but the flag was seen as a symbol of treason. Trooper King kept the flag in a draw at home. When he was aged, he offered it to many museums, eventually it was taken by the Ballarat art gallery in the 1970s. A few years later the Ballarat Eureka Museum added the flag to its collection. The flag was severely damaged, and many samples of the flag had been cut away. They sent it to South Australia to have it cleaned and mounted, the best they could.

Our trip to Ballarat was pretty amazing.

Hope we get to go there again sometime!


Reminders — Summer is fast approaching so *sunscreen, hats and drink bottles* are needed daily.


Tony has been adapting & performing CBCA short-listed & notable-listed books across Australia for

The performance was a fabulous 40-minute **LIVE** stage show that brought the Picture Book of the Year **TO LIFE!!**








